



COVID-19 Coronavirus Resources for Health Centers

The [World Health Organization](#) named the COVID-19 outbreak associated with transmission of the novel coronavirus (2019-nCoV) a public health emergency of international concern. Surveillance may help detect disease outbreaks, but healthcare organizations should remind staff and infection preventionists to promptly report unusual patient conditions, signs, and symptoms and to follow appropriate transmission-based precautions while awaiting confirmation of a patient's diagnosis. Health centers and free clinics should also collaborate with state and local health departments for information and guidance.
